Abortion: how do men react to it?

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Objectives: To investigate behaviour and feelings of the partners of women who have requested abortion. A review of existing literature on this subject suggests that very little research has been done on men's psychological reactions to their partner's abortion.

Methods: The study was carried out on two separate occasions. The first was in the Associazione Italiana Educazione Demografica (A.I.E.D.) of Genova (1994-1995), the second involved 13 Italian women's health centres (1999-2000). A questionnaire designed to address male concerns, was given to a random sample of men accompanying partners who had requested legal abortion. Chi Square and Fisher exact test were used for statistical analysis.

Results: 169 men aged 19-47 (average 33) completed a questionnaire. Most of them had a stable job (75%) and relationship (86%), but only 23% had had children. The most frequently used method of contraception by these couples was the coitus interruptus and 67% of subjects referred needed contraceptive counselling. Although the choice of abortion was taken by both partners (76%), only 37% of men thought the relationship would improve after the abortion. In 69% of subjects the event considered was associated with depression.

Conclusion: This study suggests 1) some men need to know more about contraceptives; 2) there exists a whole masculine world of feelings about abortion of which not enough is knows; 3) the family planning services should make an effort to help the couple to improve paternity awareness.
